If you use this Canine Cruciate Registry (CCR), you are agreeing to comply with and be bound by the following terms and conditions of use, which together with our privacy policy govern the Canine Cruciate Registry's relationship with you in relation to this site. Data Protection Policy

This registry enables the collection of data regarding patients undergoing treatment.

All data is subject to the General Data Protection Regulations and Data Protection Act (2018), and as such is collected under the following principles:

Each individual Veterinary Surgeon and RCVS Knowledge Canine Cruciate Registry are joint data controllers, therefore both are subject to the controller requirements set out under the General Data Protection Regulations. The data processor is Amplitude Clinical Outcomes.

As joint data controllers, RCVS Knowledge and the Veterinary Surgeon must comply with the Data Protection Act (2018) and the General Data Protection Regulations. These require data controllers to:

- Ensure appropriate security of login details, and to contact Amplitude Clinical Outcomes immediately if a breach of security is suspected.
- Ensure that explicit client consent is sought, given and recorded.
- Understand that failure to correctly indicate the acquisition of consent will lead to the deletion of identifying data upon your patients' records.
- Ensure all data is accurate, and up to date.
- Record only necessary and appropriate data.
- Only grant access to appropriate individuals under your account, and that you remain responsible for the data entry upon your patients entered by said individuals.
